#### 1. Navy Ship - construction

This vessel will be designed and equipped for both naval and scientific purposes.

#### 2. Danish Defence – Science collaboration

Danish universities are currently in the process of renewing and improving Arctic collaboration with Danish Defence regarding e.g. logistics support.

## 5. Long-term monitoring programs in Greenland

Torben Røjle Christensen has been appointed new lead of the GEM program. The program is currently being evaluated.

### 6. Alpha Film idea and progress

A crew from independent Alpha Film visited Nuuk in late August. The aim is to produce a series of short films to be used in higher school levels in Denmark and Greenland in order to attract more young students to Arctic sciences educations, by showing some examples of GINR research projects and the excellent facilities and possibilities available at GINR.

### 7. Hindsgavl meeting 29-30 september

A meeting arranged by the universities of Aarhus and Copenhagen about enhancing future Arctic collaboration between all Danish universities on research, education, logistics & infrastructure, and public counselling will be held at Danish estate Hindsgavl on 29-30 September. The meeting will have 100 participants from all Danish Kingdom universities, Government, and Defence. It is the hope this can turn into a much stronger collaboration between Denmark/Greenland and Canada on Arctic issues.

## 8. Status Station Nord buildings and activities 2015

A new research facility at Station Nord will be ready for use early spring 2015. ASP is underway with plans of having 4-5 research 15 person teams at the station between March and August.
